

## Ennis short minutes

The fourth RECIPE project meeting took place in the lovely town of Ennis in Clare County – Ireland from the 27th to 29th April 2015. The meeting was hosted by Clare Education Centre who is charged with the delivery of CPD in the Clare Region. The Director of the Centre welcomed all the partners to Ireland and thanked them for their good work to date. The meeting was held in both the Clare Education Centre and the Old Ground Hotel, which is the oldest hotel in the entire region. During the visit the partners, discussed all aspects of the project progress, visited a number of Irish schools who are participating in the RECIPE project and also visited local places of interest – Cliffs of Moher, Bunratty Castle Park and King John's Castle in nearby Limerick. All partners worked together collaboratively in the following areas.

- Presentation of case study progress and findings with a special emphasis on the Irish Case Studies – Developing LEGO in Schools, Maths Recovery in the Classroom (Mata) and Accelerated Reader Programme.
- Clare Education Centre is responsible for Quality assurance of the project. This was looked at as follows;
  - Feedback from external evaluator regarding Progress Report
  - Preparation of Survey Monkey questionnaire for meeting and feedback on evaluation of previous meeting.
  - Updating of action plan documents.
  - Feedback from partners about Course 1 \_ final agreement and distribution of work tasks
  - Clarification re. status in film production

### Other Issues

Discussion took place on building a framework of the first European RECIPE Conference and the 2nd European RECIPE Course which was provisionally fixed for Greece.

Delight was expressed at the number of applications from Ireland, to attend the Lisbon RECIPE course and it was hoped that many would be funded.
